Precision Teaching	17,070	<p>Precision teaching and planning, delivered by a fully qualified teacher for PP children.</p> <p>Children identified and work within small groups and on a one to one basis to diminish the difference in attainment.</p> <p>Support targeted individuals and groups on a regular and sustained basis.</p> <p>Ensuring consistency across year groups in methodology and approach to skills based on systems using agreed school policy.</p>	<p>Improved confidence in all areas targeted, transferring back into the classroom setting, resulting in a diminished difference in progress between PP children and non-PP children.</p> <p>Improvement of basic skills and understanding in R/W/M, including GPS.</p> <p>Diminished difference between pupil skill sets and year group expectations.</p> <p>Individualised programmes for pupils developed in conjunction with pupils.</p> <p>Improved confidence, including a development in communication skills.</p>
