Sports Premium Report 2016-2017

What is Sports Premium?

The government is providing additional PE and Sport funding for the academic year 2016-2017 to continue improving provision of physical education (PE) and sport in Primary Schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to do this as they wish.

To ensure sustainability and effective use of this investment, it is important that we invest the money in a range of ways that **aim to:**

- Increase engagement of pupils in sport
- Raise the profile of PE and Sport in school
- Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of staff across school
- Broaden the range of sports that are offered to pupils
- Increase participation in competitive sport

At St Ambrose Barlow Primary School we believe that all pupils leaving our care should be physically literate with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in sport. We consider an innovative, varied and well-balanced PE curriculum and extracurricular opportunities can have a positive impact on the pupils' concentration, attitude and academic achievement.
